**Wendy Klein** is a retired psychotherapist who lives in a deceptively elegant Victorian apartment in Berkshire. Winner of the Ware Poetry Competition (2009) and the Torriano Competition (2010), her first collection, *Cuba in the Blood* was published by Cinnamon Press in February 2009, and her second is due out in late 2012. Her most recent work, in tandem with Swedish translator Jan Teeland, is a book-length single poem by Swedish poet Helena Eriksson which has just been accepted by Shearsman Press.

**Jeremy Page** has edited *The Frogmore Papers* since 1983. He lives close to the South Downs in Lewes and teaches at the University of Sussex. He has published four collections of poems, most recently *In and Out of The Dark Wood* (HappenStance 2010). His translations of Catullus's Lesbia poems are due to be published by Ashley Press in June 2011 as *The Cost of All Desire*. His play *Loving Psyche* was staged in Bremen in 2010, and short stories have appeared in *Ambit*, *Citizen 32* and *The Interpreter's House*.



**Anne Stewart** founded the poet-showcase website, *poetry p f* ([www.poetrypf.co.uk](http://www.poetrypf.co.uk)) and she provides services to poets and poetry organisations. She was awarded an MA (Dist) in Creative Writing at Sheffield Hallam University in 2003 & won the Bridport Prize in 2008 with 'a nice little sonnet'. Her first collection, *The Janus Hour*, was published by Oversteps Books in 2010. She is the Administrator for Second Light Network and President of the Shortlands Poetry Circle.
